If I need to collect my ticket I might have to wait in a short queue, but it should not take long.



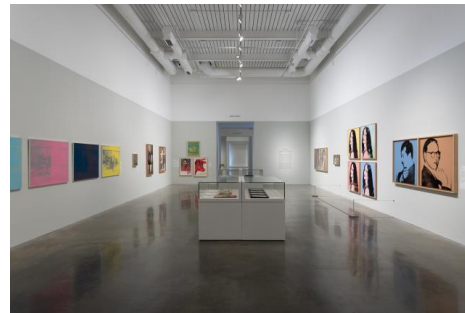
I can take my own ear defenders / sensory aids in the gallery with me if I like.

There will also be some at the front desk for me to use in the Sensory Scout Kits.



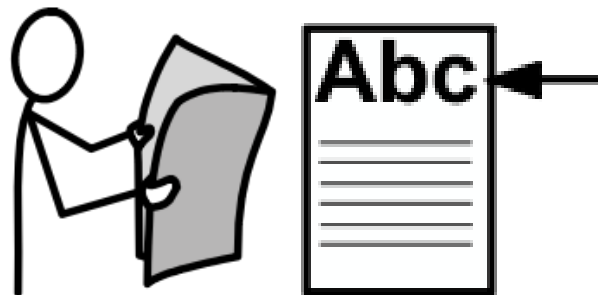
The exhibition I am going to see is called:

Andy Warhol: Portrait of America



When I enter the gallery, I will see a large wall text with the title of this exhibition and information about it

I can read this if I would like.



I will enter through Gallery 1 and can turn left to reach Gallery rooms 2,3,4 and 5.

There will be an MK Gallery staff member or volunteer standing in each room to guide and assist me if I need.



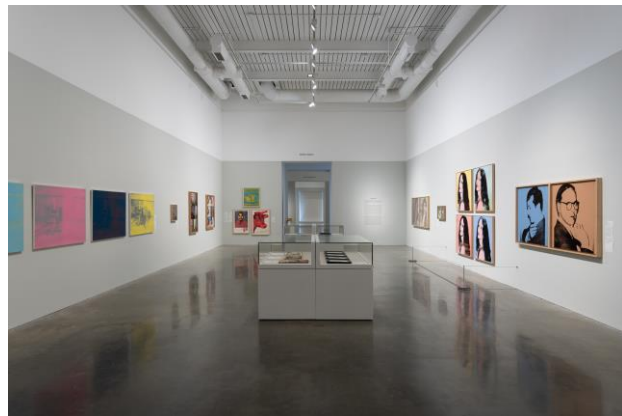
There will be areas with benches for me to take a seat.



Inside the exhibition, there are 5 big rooms full of artwork by Andy Warhol

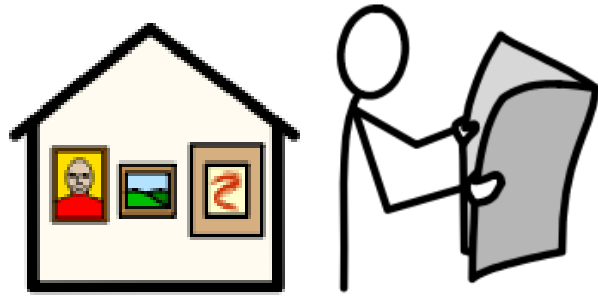
There are paintings, drawings, photographs and pictures

The walls are painted grey and white. Gallery 3 has Yellow and Pink Wallpaper with cows.



There will be text on the walls of the Gallery which explain more about the artists, their work, and the exhibition.

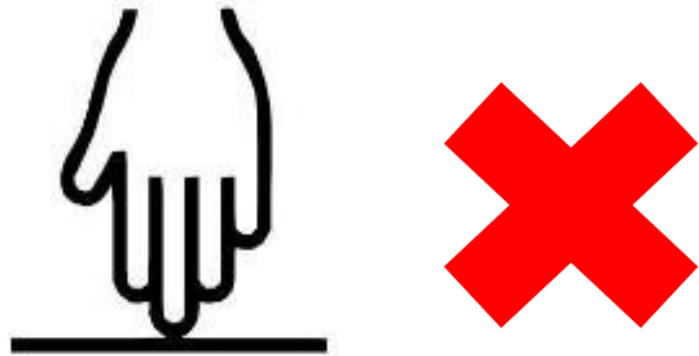
I can read these if I would like.



Some of the artwork is very fragile.

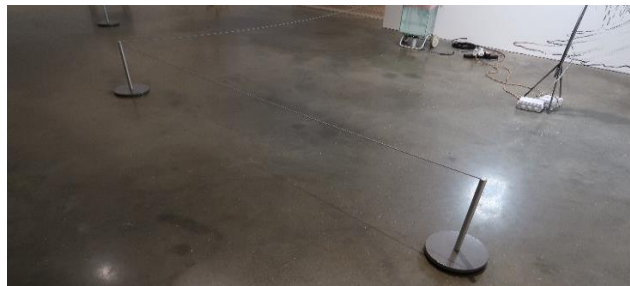
It is also all borrowed from other people.

This means I cannot touch the artwork in the main galleries.



Some of the artwork is so fragile that it has barriers in front of it to keep it safe.

It's important I stand behind these barriers.



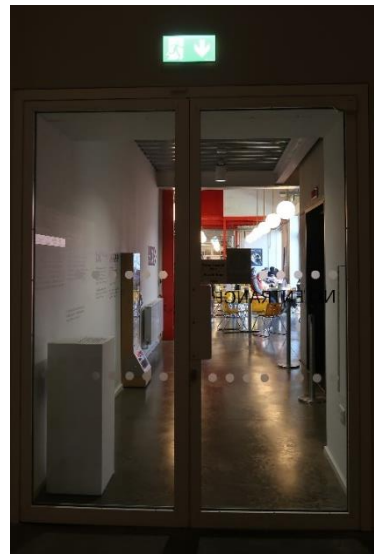
To keep myself and others stay safe I cannot run inside.

There is a Play Scape outside which is a great space for movement if I need this.



Once I am ready to leave the exhibition, I can either exit from room 5. This takes me to the Café.

Or I can head back and exit the same way I entered.



If I need the toilet, I will leave the gallery.

Staff will tell me where the nearest toilets are, or I can follow the WC signs.



I can use the stairs or a lift.



If I want to buy food or a drink, I can do this in the gallery café.
The café is painted bright red and yellow.
