




I'm going to a SEND Exhibition Tour at MK Gallery!

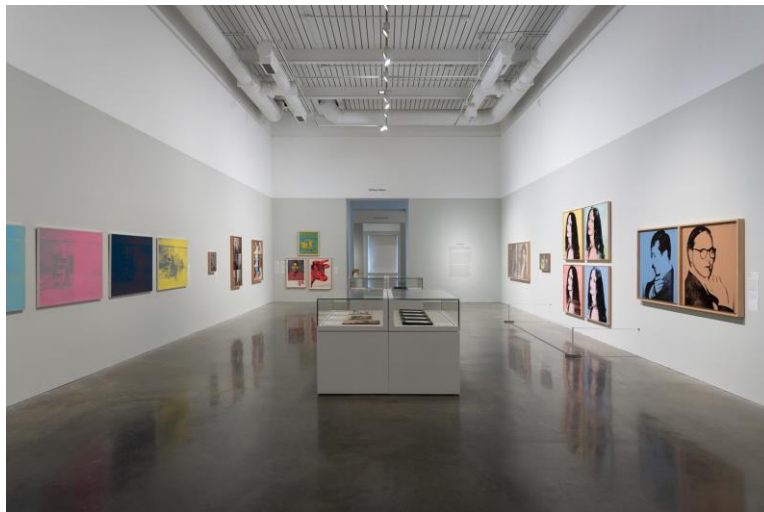


Then, me and my family will walk over to the Event Space to meet the Artist leading our tour.

I can take a break at any time I like during my visit.



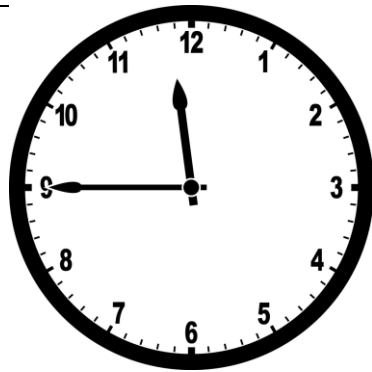
I can bring my own sensory aids too if I'd like to.
